

From the Chairperson of the Board of Trustees

A contemporary art center that bridges academic training and the greater art world, alternative space and museum, non-profit and for-profit gallery cultures, Maryland Art Place is a significant creative, social, and economic resource. Since 1981, MAP has offered professional development as well as educational and exhibition opportunities to artists, curators, and art writers at all stages of their careers.

MAP is proud that our programming remained strong in 2010, despite the economic conditions that made it a challenging year for arts non-profits all over the nation. We are grateful, as ever, to the staunch supporters and friends who kept us going, and who continue to sustain us as we begin 2011.

In the past twelve months, MAP has mounted **eight** successful exhibitions, including our first-ever public performance art project, and new partnerships with the Contemporary Museum, the Walters Art Museum, MICA, and other prominent organizations. Our annual Out of Order exhibition was among our most successful to date, with over 300 artists participating. As a new feature of that event, an arrangement with the Art Connection in the Capital Region allowed the option for unsold work to be donated and placed in public collections. Our well-received pilot program of workshops included a Portfolio Review workshop, and an Internet Copyright workshop, in partnership with Maryland Lawyers for the Arts. Gallery talks, 'rush hour' cocktail receptions, and our Pop Up Gala rounded out the year's programs.

We begin 2011 with a change of leadership. In the absence of an Executive Director, key Board members will be fulfilling that role on an interim basis, most notably Board President Barbie Hart and myself. With 30 years of active involvement with MAP under our belts, we will be overseeing MAP's daily operations and ensuring the stability of its administrative functions, programming, and development. We are excited to share our plans for this year with you. Highlights will include:

- A new and vibrant season of programming, under the direction of Consulting Curator Michael Klein, will include *New Wallworks*, an exhibition of works that push the boundaries between painting and sculpture; and *Painting in Parts*, an exhibition of internationally known minimalist painters.
- Our new speakers' series will begin April 2nd when distinguished professor Gail Levin of CUNY gives a talk entitled *Grace Hartigan and Lee Krasner: The Friendship of Two Abstract Expressionists in the 1950s and After*.
- We will build on the success of our workshop series by offering 'Baltimore Photograms' and 'Paper City Workshop', as well as encores of our popular 'Curating 101' and portfolio workshops.
- We will continue to operate and enhance the Visual Artists' Registry and Resource Bulletin in partnership with Maryland State Arts Council.
- We will continue the programming that we are known for regionally, with the Young Blood exhibition of newly-minted MFA graduates, our annual Out of Order event, our Fall Gala, and participation in the Transmodern Festival and Artscape.
- We continue our successful *Curators' Incubator* series with 'Small Magic', curated by Nate Larson, February 3rd to March 19th.

All of us at MAP are looking forward to an exciting and successful year, and anticipate the future with a renewed and focused purpose. We hope you will join us as we continue to fulfill our mission to serve artists and art enthusiasts and promote the talent of emerging and established artists within the region.
